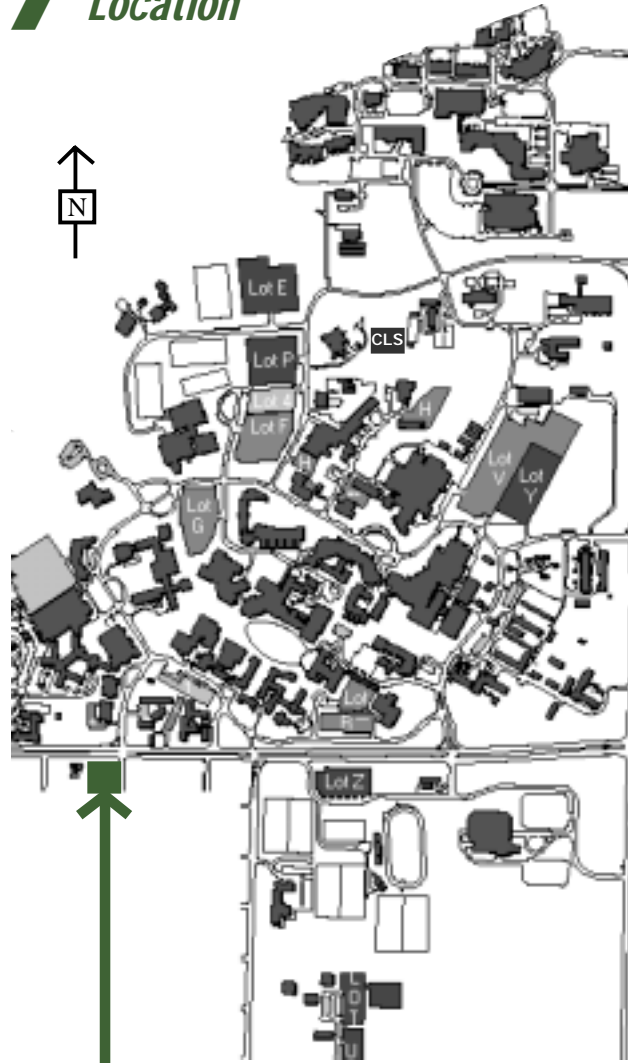
Ukrainian Catholic Religious Education Centre

Metropolitan Andrey Sheptytsky Institute is owned by the Ukrainian Catholic Episcopal Corporation of Saskatchewan (Eparchy of Saskatoon), and managed by the Metropolitan Sheptytsky Society of Saskatchewan. The Institute was built to provide a residence in Saskatoon for Ukrainian Catholic students pursuing post-secondary training and education. It has served the community since 1953. In 1979, it became co-ed and continues to flourish as the only Ukrainian Catholic student residence in North America. We have an energetic student body, dedicated staff and a supportive, active Board of Directors. Our alumni and community organizations are also very much a part of the Institute!

Our Goal

"To provide an academic facility that reflects Christian values and ideals with respect to all activities, social and personal relationships."

Students will have the opportunity to learn to live in an academic environment and to accept the responsibilities which are part of group living. We also want students to experience something unique in terms of Ukrainian culture and Eastern spirituality during their stay at the Institute.

Student Representative Council

The SRC consists of students who represent and serve the non-academic needs of their peers. They work towards enhancing the experience of those living at the Institute and studying at the U of S, while acknowledging the diverse backgrounds of all. The SRC is a member of the U of S Students' Union.
